

Message presented to the Right Rev  
Bishop of Clogher  
After the Service and Congregation  
held at the  
Church of the Brown Pastor  
on  
the 19. April 1910

To His Excellency Right Rev Father in Christ  
the Bishop of Clogher

We the Clergy and the Church Council  
being the legitimate representatives of the  
Lusitanian Church of the Brown Pastor  
Council, most sincerely beg to present your  
blessing with our congratulations upon the  
most pleasing visit that you have paid  
to our congregation, and to thank you  
most gratefully for having condescended  
to our brethren in the family of Christ.

Will your  
blessing permit us to relate in a few words  
a resume, or sketch of some of the work done  
during the last 28 years, during which  
time the blessing of God has accompanied us.

We began  
the work for the Master in the summer  
of 1882 at the sea side resort of Laradale  
afterwards carrying on the work to Caudal  
in the autumn of the same year.

As the  
work increased and began to take root we  
established here in Caudal the same year

in the Rue do Souto a Primary School, marking the very first school established in this locality & neighbourhood.

The School prospered so that it was necessary to build the present large School House which were finished in 1884.

On the 6 of January 1887 our present Church was opened for Divine Service and from that day the work has branched out to different places.

In the year 1883 assisted by Mr Fred W Flores we established missions in the Mares, and the effourada de Baixo which were well attended.

In the year 1898 we established a mission for the River side people at Gaia which was well attended, and to day we have members on our Church Council from that locality.

In the year 1901 we established the mission in the City of Guimaraes and our people were the very first to have their names in the Government Civil Registration at the Office of the Administrators.

Also in the following year 1902 we began the mission in the City of Viana do Castello where the first registration of the death of a child according to Civil Law caused such an uproar in the place.

In the year 1905 we first began the mission in Magdelema and to day some of the brethren confined are from that mission.

In 1908 we began the publication of the Popular Evangelical books and tracts entitled the Library of Antonio Maria Scindal, and we have already published

13 popular works, 1 Almanac, and 8 large picture and Texts, Carols, and 12 numbers of our Parish Journal the Bow Pastor, being a total of 46,000 copies which we have very largely distributed very largely all over our country, and also in the Brazils.

We ever remember with regret, and honour the loving memory of a Sister in the faith who was called home in 1892, who first succeeded in calling and asking our neighbours and others to attend our Services, and who organised our School in the first instance.

Our presbyter who began this work was licensed by the Standing Committee of the Lusitanian Church, and was ordained deacon by his grace Lord Plunket in Dublin in 1891, and was ordained a Presbyter by Don Juan Cabrera of Madrid in the year 1895.

Our deacon began to preach the Gospel as a layman in 1898 and was licensed as a preacher by the Synod of the Lusitanian Church in 1903 and was ordained by Bishop St Juan Calzada in 1908.

As the work increases we have great difficulty owing to the want of a large parish Room, in which to hold the meetings of our flourishing YWCA and YMCA, and also we are much hampered for the want of the necessary funds to send out Clergy and Evangelists up the Country to preach the Gospel, this in reply to the very urgent intimation that we are constantly receiving from members of our church and others in the interior.

Our ministers are overburdened with work but they endeavor to seize every opportunity that the work of the Lord may be known and that God may be glorified and souls saved.

We desire again on this occasion  
to thank your lordship most  
heartily for your visit. And  
we most respectfully beg you  
to present to the other members  
of our Council of Bishops our  
humble salutations.
